


Figure 1.1 Graphical representation of response given by Teachers

# > Begin to establish an effective environment on the first day of class

First impressions are extremely important in setting the tone for the rest of the semester or year so plan your first class carefully: Consider setting Classroom rules (e.g., regarding carrying and attending phones, laptops, talking/chitchats, sleeping, eating, arriving late, and leaving early) with the students; the rules and expectations should be made clear in the initial lecture only and should be practised throughout and with everyone whosoever go against the rules.

## > Connecting with students

Some teachers think that good classroom management is all about law and order. But this is not correct completely. A classroom where there is mutual love trust and connect between teacher and students, the chances of disruptions automatically fades away. In such classroom culture students are more participative and engaged and thus they invest themselves in learning process, which is great for both the teacher and the students as well.

## > Create a learning space that matches your needs

These days, there are no set rules for what a classroom needs to look like. Think about your teaching style, and create a classroom with areas that match. Do you do a lot of group work? Use tables, or desks that can easily be rearranged. Be sure to provide spaces for students to work on their own comfortably, and accommodate any special needs. Consider asking students to help create the space that helps them learn, and be open to their suggestions.

## > Establish a behaviour management plan

Every single teacher must be prepared with specific plans for behaviour issues, including consequences for poor choices. Determine what you'll say and do (it can help to role-play some common scenarios with more experienced teachers in advance). Try to match consequences with behaviours, so they're more meaningful for students. In the heat of the moment, it can be tough to hand out a consequence. Enforce the consequence without any emotion. "You did this, and the consequence is this." This helps students see that the behaviour is unacceptable, but the student is still valuable

This is really important, and I want to make sure you're able to do what you need to do." Stop trying for every possible way to do things for your students, and instead find different ways they can do things for themselves.

- Use softer voice so students really have to listen to what you're saying
